Quick Tips

- Many local employment opportunities are highly competitive and filled quickly. It is important
 to have a general resume prepared in advance, so that it may be quickly tailored and
 submitted to open positions.
- If you are considering Federal employment, it is important to have a narrative resume prepared that can be tailored and submitted with additional required documents prior to the closing date. Narrative resumes are significantly different from traditional 1-page resumes!
- If you are considering working for an organization contracted with the government, make sure to use a traditional, private-sector resume that is **tailored** to the position announcement.
- Always **read application instructions** CAREFULLY to ensure you submit all required documents, with the requested information and in the requested format (ex: .pdf or.docx).
- Create a profile on verified employer/recruitment sites that hire for positions in your field.
 - Keep your profile and contact information updated!
 - Save searches so you can get emails when opportunities open.
 - Some employers also send emails about upcoming recruitment events for individuals with profiles, make sure to check your inbox (and spam folder) regularly.
- Consider both your short and long-term goals—many unexpected, volunteer, and/or short-term opportunities can allow you to explore new career paths and equip you with a variety of employable skills that will support your long-term goals.
- Off Post Employment: To lawfully work on the Korean economy, SOFA Family Members must have a ROK employment permit which is obtained through a legitimate Korean employer. It is strongly recommended that individuals consult with the legal assistance office prior to entering into any employment contracts/agreements for employment off post.
